CROQUET PARTY ON SUNDAY, AUG. 23

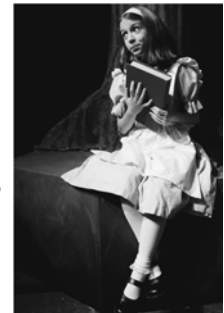


Step back in time for the fourth annual Colonel's Croquet Party on Sunday, August 23 on Arsenal Island at 2:00 p.m. Dress in your croquet whites (not required) to play the same game of croquet you play in your backyard. Croquet courts will be set up on the lawn of the historic Quarters One, next to the Arsenal Golf Club.

Teams of two can play in the fun round-robin tournament. Or there will be courts set up to just join in the fun and play croquet with other enthusiasts in the Quad Cities.

Teams in the tournament portion are awarded a point for each wicket they pass through. There will a review of nine-wicket rules before play begins. Players will compete for the coveted Colonel Davenport trophy.

Croquet equipment will be provided. There will be hors d'oeuvres and drinks served al fresco at Quarters One. No -host bar available. Creekside Vineyards Winery in Coal Valley, Ill., will provide a complimentary wine tasting. Attendees also receive a pass for a complimentary guided tour of the Colonel Davenport House.

Tickets are \$25.00 for adults; and \$10.00 for children 11 years and younger to attend the Colonel's Croquet Party. Hors d'oeuvres, croquet play, wine tasting, and tours of the house are included. PIONEER DAYS BRINGS BUCKSKINNERS & FAMILIES

This year the CDHF expanded its third annual Pioneer Days celebration to two days on Saturday and Sunday, June 13-14, also it was part of the new Quad Cities Museum Week.

There was an overnight encampment of fur trader re-enactors, called a Buckskinners' Rendezvous, with pioneer portrayers demonstrating hatchet and knife throwing, and craft demonstrators such as wood-working, chair caning, spinning, quilting, basket making, and campfire cooking.

There was also historical re-enactors and activities/demonstrations from the Belgian Lace-makers, Buffalo Bill Museum, Moline



Preservation Society, Rock Island Arsenal Museum, River Share Library, face-painting, hair-braiding, and more.

Larry Lockwood did a demonstration on Saturday on a drum and a recitation on the Indian influence of the pioneer era. Larry Lockwood is a member of the Northern Cheyenne tribe and also belongs to the Native American Coalition of the Quad Cities.
